### **Agile Learning Spaces, what are they and why do we have them?**

In 2018 some of our grades at St Patrick's have moved into Agile Learning Spaces. Agile spaces are learning spaces that can be easily rearranged to enable learning to take *place as group work, whole class presentations, paired work* or a combination.

These spaces have been introduced within the Diocese of Parramatta to promote student learning and enhance teacher practice. Research shows that good teachers make a difference to student's learning. Agile spaces allow teachers to work together rather than in isolation. When teachers work together sharing their expertise on teaching and learning, reviewing data and the responsibility of students they are continuously improving their instruction. Children who have access to these improved practices and instructions have a greater chance of learning the desired outcomes.

Agile Learning Spaces are classrooms where everyone is learning together. This means they provide opportunities for people to work together in collaborative and exciting ways.



### **SECOND HAND CLOTHING POOL**

## Positive Behaviour Support for Learning

At St Patrick's we have begun the implementation of PBS4L (Positive Behaviour Support for Learning) a whole school approach for creating a positive, safe and supportive school climate in which students can learn and develop. Every member of the school community (school staff, parents and students) work together establishes expectations that reinforce positive behaviours. It provides a common language and purpose in relation to behaviour. The framework's aim is to improve pupil behaviour and increase learning times.

Talk to your child about these expectations and what they mean. The teachers will be modelling these expectations throughout the school day in the way they speak and act around the children. You can also be a role model when you

- show your child how proud you are of them
- talk about and celebrate their achievements
- are thoughtful and caring towards others

## How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

### For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "Install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

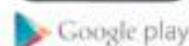


### For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

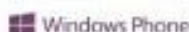
Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.



### For Windows 8.1 Phone and Windows 8.1 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
3. Install the Skoolbag app
4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: The Skoolbag Windows App is for 8.1 version Windows Phones, or Windows 8.1 and 10 devices.
