ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

READING & WRITING TESTS in NAPLAN

In Week 4, our Year 3 and Year 5 students will sit NAPLAN. The first of the NAPLAN tests is on writing. In the

writing test, students are provided with a 'writing stimulus' (a prompt on an idea or topic) and asked to write a response that either persuades, informs or entertains the reader.

To date, students have only been tested on narrative writing (a text that entertains) and persuasive writing (a text that persuades). Informative writing has not yet been tested by NAPLAN. The type of text will be revealed on the day of the assessment.



The NAPLAN reading test which follows the writing test,

measures literacy proficiency across the English learning area. In this test, students are provided with a range of texts that illustrate different writing styles. Students read the texts provided then answer the related questions.

The skills demonstrated in reading are dependent on the complexity and accessibility of the text. Typically students engage with more complex texts as their reading comprehension skills improve. There is a very wide range of reading ability levels at each school year level so the tests start with simple, short texts and get increasingly longer and harder.

In Year 3, reading texts tend to have predictable text and sentence structures. Words that may be unfamiliar are explained in the writing or through the accompanying illustrations. Typically, these texts use familiar, everyday language.

Year 3 students generally make some meaning from short texts, such as stories and simple reports, which have some visual support. They make connections between directly stated information and between text and pictures.

When reading simple imaginative texts (stories), students can:

- find directly stated information
- connect ideas across sentences and paragraphs
- interpret ideas, including some expressed in complex sentences
- identify a sequence of events
- infer the writer's feelings.

When reading simple **information texts (reports)**, students can:

- find directly stated information
- connect an illustration with ideas in the text
- locate a detail in the text
- identify the meaning of a word in context
- connect ideas within a sentence and across the text
- identify the purpose of the text
- identify conventions such as lists and those conventions used in a letter.





In Year 5, reading texts may include a range of genre including biographies, autobiographies and persuasive texts such as advertisements. Sentence structure may be varied. Some unfamiliar vocabulary is included, particularly subject-specific words, but its use will be supported by text and illustrations.

Year 5 students generally interpret ideas in simple texts and make connections between ideas that are not stated. They identify the purpose of a text as well as parts of a text such as diagrams and illustrations.

When reading a short **narrative**, students can:

- locate directly stated information
- connect and interpret ideas
- recognise the relationship between text and illustrations
- interpret the nature, behaviour and motivation of characters
- identify cause and effect.

When reading an **information text**, students can:

- locate directly stated information
- connect ideas to identify cause and effect
- identify the main purpose for the inclusion of specific information, diagrams and illustrations
- identify the meaning of a phrase in context
- infer the main idea of a paragraph.

When reading a biography or autobiography, students can:

- connect ideas
- identify the main purpose of the text
- make inferences about the impact of an event on the narrator
- interpret an idiomatic phrase or the meaning of a simple figurative expression.

When reading a persuasive text such as an advertisement, students can:

- locate directly stated information
- identify the main idea of a paragraph or the main message of the text.

Easter Season Lasts 50 Days

"The word, 'Pascha,' or 'Pasch,' comes from the Greek word for the 'Passover.' The early Christians used the word to describe the resurrection of Jesus as the Christian Passover. Today, we sometimes refer to the death and resurrection of Jesus as the Paschal Mystery, which is derived from the word, 'Pasch.' Orthodox Christians still use the word, 'Pascha' when referring to Easter.

The proclamation of Easter does not end with Easter Sunday: That is only the beginning. The Easter season, known as Easter Time, is celebrated for 50 days. It culminates with the celebration of Jesus' ascension into heaven, and Pentecost, which marks the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and birthday of the Church.

The prayer can be traced back to the 16th Century and has become a Prayer of the Church.

Everyday at 12pm the school will be praying the Regina Coeli.





NEW CHILD PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR PARENTS

Parents and carers are being encouraged, to once again, become involved in our school life.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for, or provide services to Parramatta schools. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities. CEDP has launched a NEW Building Child Safe Communities undertaking form and online training module that ALL volunteers are required to complete. The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

- 1. The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete.
- 2. The training module should take approximately 10 minutes to complete.


Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission. The undertaking form will expire within two years and at that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs. BUILDING UPDATE


