- do not send your child to school if they are sick (please note that the Kindergarten outbreak was not the result of a child being sent to school sick)
- get your child tested when there is even the slightest possibility, even if your child doesn't want to
- do not engage in false information that is circulating online we advise our parents to always exercise caution when reading information online regarding sensitive or controversial issues. If you ever have concerns or hear something you are unsure of, always get in touch with the school for clarification.

As Mrs Hoey and I reflected last night we both acknowledged how proud we were of the St Patrick's community. It is during times of challenge that the structures, processes and the culture of a school are tested.

St Mary of the Cross, you faced difficult times with a heart filled with trust, always believing in the watchful presence of God. Walk with us now in this difficult time, and may we be for others, examples of hope and trust.

Please continue to stay safe and vigilant.

# **ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Many children, especially struggling readers, forget some of what they've learnt during the summer holidays. To avoid this summer slide try some of the following strategies during the Christmas holidays:

**Six books to summer success:** Research shows that reading just six books during the summer may keep a struggling reader from regressing. When choosing the six, be sure that they are just right — not too hard and not too easy. Take advantage of your local library. Ask for help selecting books that match your child's age, interests, and abilities.

**Read something every day:** Encourage your child to take advantage of every opportunity to read. Find them throughout the day. They can read the newspaper — even if it is just the comics or today's weather, magazines, online websites, etc. For example, if your child likes the food channel, help them to look for a recipe on the network's website — then cook it together for more reading practise.

**Keep reading aloud:** Reading aloud benefits all children and teens, especially those who struggle. One benefit is that you can read books your child can't. This will increase their knowledge and expand their experiences with texts, so that they will do better when they read on their own.

Entrants must fill out all required fields on the entry form as well as telling Mr Whitby in 50 words or less why you loved the book, e-book, animated novel, comic, play or piece of poetry. After submitting the required information on the entry form, you will receive one (1) entry into the drawing. The more materials read, the more chances of entering the competition. You can enter as many times as you like BUT you must describe why you liked a different book, e-book, animated novel, comic, play or piece of poetry each entry.

The competition opens on 1 November 2021 and closes at 5pm on 25 February 2022. You can enter as many times as you like!
