THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Catholic Church celebrates the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne. The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church.



Mary's father Joachim has been described as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply sad, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness.

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves extensively and rigorously to prayer and fasting to please God as they thought God had not given them a child because he wasn't pleased by them.

As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah were with Isaac, as an angel revealed to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honor their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth, and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

After Mary's birth Anne "made a sanctuary" in the infant girl's room, and "allowed nothing common or unclean" on account of the special holiness of the child. When she was one year old, her father "made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel."

"And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations' . . . And he brought her to the chief priests, and they blessed her, saying: 'O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be for ever."

May we have the faith of Mary and her parents to believe in God's will in our lives. Let us remember to celebrate what God has granted us and recall those who may need our prayers, help and support. Our Mother Mary, Pray for us.

To showcase the work of schools in the Diocese, each school has created a visual display of their school totem project at the conference. Below are photos of the St Patrick's totem and information describing the totem. At the conclusion of the conference it will be displayed in the administration foyer.



At St Patrick's Primary Guildford, like peacocks, we are loyal and true to our word. We remain honest in every area of life and have deep values and beliefs. Our students walk their talk and sometimes go far with that, but at the end of the day, life is all about living with truth and honesty. This ability makes us born leaders. We have great characteristics inside and out. Like peacocks, we let our inner beauty shine and hold close to our self-esteem. As a school community we live by the words. Just try to be a kind-hearted person that you are from within. When you remain kind to others, it comes back in surprising ways. At the start of our totem journey, we incorporated learning experiences within our Creative Arts lessons.

Students in Stage 3 researched native animals in our area and carried out an investigation. At the completion of their research students presented their findings through PowerPoint presentations and chose the totem based on research presented alongside staff members. Although a peacock is not native to our local area, students persuaded their audience that there is a peacock in Central Gardens Nature Reserve in Cumberland. So, the peacock was our focus for our totem project.

Students in Early Stage 1, Stage 1 and Stage 2 started participating in a range of peacock activities such as, creating peacocks within Visual Arts and dancing and movements to impersonate a peacock.

There were many reasons the peacock was chosen to represent our school; these included the colours of a peacock being the same as our school colours. Many of the peacock traits identified on our second canvas represent the traits we share.

As a staff we encourage our students to always embrace who they are. Like peacocks, we encourage them to not hide their feathers but embrace their beauty, talent, skill, and let them shine.


